

ADDRESSING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Gender-Based Violence (GBV) is violence directed at an individual based on biological sex, gender identity or socially defined norms of masculinity and femininity. Marginalized groups, including persons with disabilities, and those in the Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual and Transgender community are at a higher risk of experiencing GBV. GBV negatively harms individuals and societies.

Female genital mutilation

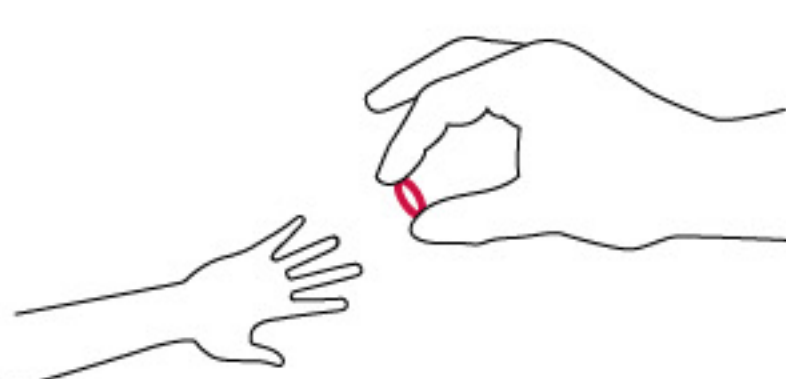

THE PROBLEM



1 in 3 women worldwide have experienced physical or sexual violence. ¹



There are over **14 million** child marriages each year. ²



Sexual violence against men and boys has been reported in over **25** conflict-affected countries in the last decade. ³



Over **1,700** transgender persons have been murdered in 63 countries over the past seven years. ⁴

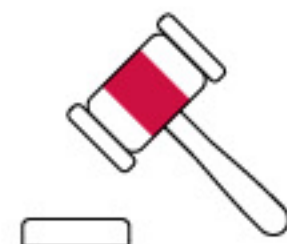

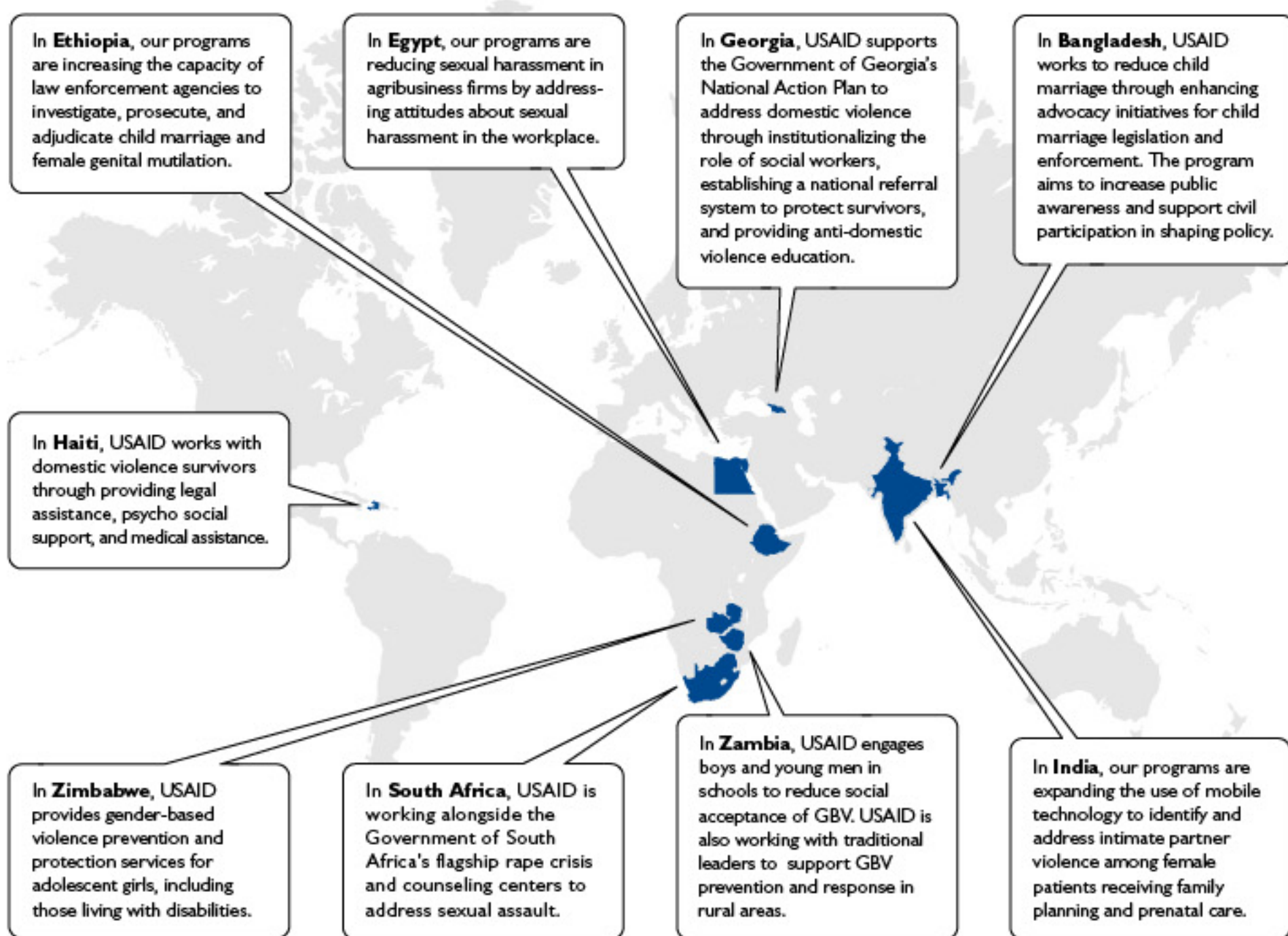
