INVESTING IN PEOPLE			
Basic Education Services: The education program focuses on basic education with a nationwide project aimed at improving the early grade reading skills of children in primary schools. USAID works closely with the Ministry of Education, other donors, and development stakeholders to create an education sector that has the capacity to manage and lead its schools. The higher education activities create partnerships among American universities, implementing partners and Ethiopian universities.	\$35	\$25	\$27
Maternal-Child and Reproductive Health: In partnership with the Ministry of Health, activities expand and improve primary health care, nutrition and family services, especially reproductive, maternal and child health and manage infectious disease such as tuberculosis. FY 2016 includes \$2.5 million from South Korea's KOICA.	\$93	\$93	\$98
Malaria Control: As part of the President's Malaria Initiative (PMI), activities with the Ministry of Health work to prevent and control malaria by spraying households with residual insecticide, distributing insecticide-treated mosquito nets, and delivering diagnostic tests and antimalarial drugs. PMI works to expand proven preventive and treatment interventions toward achievement of 85 percent coverage among vulnerable groups to help reduce malaria-related morbidity by 70 percent.	\$45	\$44	\$40
Water and Sanitation: Activities increase access to safe water and sanitation as well as promote hygiene best practices.	\$13	\$15	\$12
Combating HIV/AIDS: As part of the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), activities with the Government of Ethiopia concentrate on HIV/AIDS prevention, care and support, and treatment including services for orphans and vulnerable children. Productive Safety Net: The Title II Development Assistance Program supports Ethiopia's Productive Safety Net Program/Household Assets Building Program.
